Pre-Transplant Shielded Applications

Spartan Charge may be applied pre-transplant with directed, shielded sprayers to row middles where peppers are grown on plastic mulch. Make applications up to the shoulders of plastic mulch covered beds before transplanting with directed shielded sprayers. Avoid application of Spartan Charge onto the plastic mulch covered beds. Spartan Charge may be applied at the rate of 4.5 ounces (0.12 pounds active) to 7.6 ounces (0.21 pounds active) per acre. Applications should be made in a minimum of 10 gallons of finished spray per acre. For applications greater than 3 weeks before transplanting, use high rate within the appropriate rate range for soil and organic type listed in the use rate chart above. If weeds are emerged at the time of Spartan Charge application, use a burndown herbicide at the full-labeled rate in combination with Spartan Charge or split application as needed. If dry conditions persist following pre-transplant application of Spartan Charge, a shallow incorporation may be needed to incorporate and activate the herbicide. Care must be taken in setting up the cultivator equipment to not damage the plastic mulch bed covers. Spray residue must be completely dry after a Spartan Charge application before transplanting peppers.

Post-Transplant Shielded Applications

Spartan Charge may be applied post transplant with directed, shielded sprayers to row middles where peppers are grown on plastic mulch. Spartan Charge may be applied at the rate of 4.5 ounces (0.12 pounds active) to 7.6 ounces (0.21 pounds active) per acre. Spartan Charge may be applied after transplanted peppers have recovered from transplant shock and are actively growing. Applications should be made in a minimum of 10 gallons of finished spray per acre. If weeds are emerged at the time of Spartan Charge application, a postemergence herbicide labeled for use in peppers may be used in combination with Spartan Charge or split application as needed. If dry conditions persist following post transplant application of Spartan Charge, a shallow incorporation may be needed to incorporate and activate the herbicide. Care must be taken in setting up cultivator equipment to not damage plastic mulch bed covers.

When applied according to directions, Spartan Charge will provide control of:

Apple of Peru
ALS Resistant Lambsquarters
Yellow Nutsedge

Precautions

These Crop Specific Use directions are based upon the interactive effects of Spartan Charge and the primary soil and environmental factors, which affect its activity on various weed species and tolerance among crops. As soil pH increases, and/or soil organic matter decreases, the activity of Spartan Charge may also increase. The user is required to observe the instructions and guidance previously presented under Application Instructions, Product Use Rates, Rotational Crop Guidelines, Replanting Instructions, Weed Controlled and any other section of the full Spartan Charge section 3 label pertinent to the anticipated crop use. The use of Spartan Charge on peppers in fields or parts of fields with pH greater than 7.0 is not recommended. It is important to note that not all varieties or cultivars of a given crop species have been evaluated under treatment with Spartan Charge. Consult university or extension weed management specialists for additional information on specific local varieties or cultivars and any other pertinent information on Spartan Charge under specific local conditions.

Hooded sprayers must be designed, adjusted and operated in such a manner to totally enclose the spray pattern and to prevent any spray deposition to green stem tissue, foliage, blooms or fruit of the crop.

Restrictions

Do not apply more than 7.6 oz (0.21 pound active) total per twelve-month period. The twelve-month period is considered to begin upon the initial Spartan Charge application.

Do not incorporate to depths greater than 2 inches.

Do not apply to frozen soils or to existing snow cover to prevent Spartan Charge runoff from rain or snow melt that may occur following application.

Do not use on soils classified as sand, which have less than 1% organic matter.
