Use Advisory on Almonds in Merced and Stanislaus Counties

- Use of Pindar GT is subject to all use precautions and limitations imposed by the label affixed to the container for Pindar GT.

The use of Pindar GT herbicide in Merced and Stanislaus Counties within the general area of Hwy 99 and east of the highway, under the conditions identified below may cause injury to almond trees. Growers in this area must be aware that they assume the risk when using Pindar GT for weed control in almond trees.

Almond trees grown in soils with a high sand content, a low CED, and little to no organic matter content may be subject to a rapid uptake of herbicide during root flush. Under certain stressed conditions this rapid uptake may result in reduced tree tolerance. These conditions may include one or more of the following:

- Poor tree health and growth
- Irrigation induced stress (drought conditions)
- Nutrient deficiency
- Disease stress
- Insect and/or nematode related damage
- Shake damage
- Stress induced from previous herbicide practices including preemergent and contact sprays
- Trees grown on cut and fill sites resulting in shallow soil profiles (hardpans)
- Poor soil conditions including excessive salt and soil compaction.

Care should be taken to assure that over application does not occur. The following best application practices are recommended to avoid over application:

- Proper calibration of spray equipment prior to making a herbicide application
- Using the correct rate of product and application volume per acre
- Maintaining the recommended sprayer speed
- Turning sprayer off before slowing down to make end-row turns
- Avoiding application overlap within rows and on headland passes

Use of Pindar GT herbicide in the spring after almond bloom is not recommended in the geography described above under the conditions identified.
